COVID POLICY



The COVID-19 virus has been challenging for all, but has been particularly challenging for arts and culture organizations looking to reopen and resume programming. The Beverly Arts Center is eager to welcome audiences back but recognize that we need to be able to do so safely. To this end, our organization has joined the Coalition of Chicago Theaters, a growing group of over 65 Chicagoland arts venues and producers, and have adopted their COVID-19 Vaccination and Mask Requirements. **Our policy was effective Monday, November 29th, 2021.** Current Coalition protocols were developed in consultation with public health officials, and will be reviewed regularly and may include an extension or relaxation of certain provisions as the science dictates.

In the interest of the public health and safety of our patrons, students, artists and staff, the Beverly Arts Center is implementing the following procedures:

For our artists, crew and staff:

- All Beverly Arts Center performers, backstage crew and staff will comply with vaccination requirements and testing protocols to further ensure the safety of all guests and company members.
- Performers who have met the vaccination and testing requirements may be unmasked while onstage, but masks are required offstage and in all other parts of our facility.

For patrons attending live performances and events:

- All patrons, regardless of age or vaccine status must wear a mask over their mouth and nose while inside Beverly Arts Center.
- At performances where refreshments are available, patrons may be temporarily unmasked when actively eating or drinking. During times that patrons are unmasked, we are asking that social distancing rules be observed

When you arrive at the BAC, all patrons age 18+ will be asked to **share a picture ID and any one of the following:**

- **A vaccination card demonstrating that the patron is fully vaccinated.** “Fully vaccinated” means the performance date must be at least 14 days after the second dose of a two-dose COVID-19 vaccine, or at least 14 days after a single-dose vaccine, **OR**
- **Proof of a COVID-19 PCR test** taken within 72 hours of the performance start time, **OR**
- **Proof of a negative COVID-19 antigen test** taken within 6 hours of the performance start time.

Beverly Arts Center has partnered with Rush Health to provide access to free COVID-19 testing at no cost and with no insurance necessary. Information on how to access these tests is available on our homepage.
